

**DISEASE:****Autosomal dominant focal non-epidermolytic palmoplantar keratoderma with plantar blistering**

<b>NAME:</b>	Autosomal dominant focal non-epidermolytic palmoplantar keratoderma with plantar blistering
<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	A rare, genetic, isolated, focal palmoplantar keratoderma disease characterized by focal thickening of the skin of the soles, and often of the palms, associated with minimal or no nail involvement. Patients frequently present non-epidermolytic painful plantar blistering and, occasionally, subtle oral leukokeratosis or plantar hyperhidrosis.
